Procedure for visiting Stennis Space Center

- Our club meets Tuesdays at 11:30 a.m. in Building 1103 in the Herman Glazier Conference Room.
- Anyone wishing to come onto Stennis must have a visitor badge issued upon arrival. We will have your name(s) put on the visitor list for Stennis admittance.
- Please let us know that you wish to visit at least the morning of the meeting--earlier would be better--so that we can put you on the visitor list. Email President Angela Sallis at arsallis@hotmail.com or call 228-688-5604.
- Visitors must have a valid photo ID to receive visitor badges.
- Please note that visits to Stennis by non-U.S. citizens require special advance arrangements.
- Stennis has two reception centers: one at the South Gate (located at the Interstate 10 entrance) and one at the North Gate (located off Interstate 59 at Highway 607).
- Please allow at least 30 minutes for visitor badge issue. Lines for badge issue may become long, depending on the time of day.

About Stennis Rotary Club

The Stennis Rotary Club was admitted to Rotary International on June 22, 2000. Our club is unique because no one lives at Stennis; our members come from the surrounding area in both Louisiana and Mississippi. Some members work onsite and others come in especially for meetings.

The Stennis Rotary Club is involved in a broad array of projects. After Hurricane Katrina, we adopted the town of Pearllington, MS and we have helped with many projects there including providing holiday dinners and holding a health fair. Most recently, we teamed with other Rotary Clubs to purchase and equip a mobile medical unit that can be brought in after an emergency.

With our annual golf tournament, we support the Boys and Girls Club of the Gulf Coast Hancock Unit and the Mount Olive Food Bank in Slidell, LA. We sponsor the Interact Club at Northshore High School, and we have provided playground equipment for South Hancock Elementary School. Since 2008, the Rotary Club of Stennis Space Center has awarded the Ken and Susan Cooper Memorial Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 on a competitive basis to a graduating high school senior residing in either Mississippi or Louisiana and planning to continue onto college.
